## INFORMATION FROM HEFIN ON THE POST 16 YOUTH WORK TEAM:

Identify and support vulnerable young people (16-25), including those who are NEET, leaving care, known to Youth Justice, have accommodation issues or require a TAF.

Work with vulnerably young people on an individual and group basis.

Deliver a range of personal support for families and young people to tackle multiple barriers to entry into education, employment and training.

Enable and support progression to education, employment and training.

Drop-ins open to young people (16-25) across the county:

- Carmarthen: Tuesday @ Dr.Mz Youth Project 12-4pm.
- Llanelli: Wednesday @ Bwlch Youth Centre 2-4pm
- Ammanford: Wednesday @ Streets Youth Project 1-4pm

The team work throughout Carmarthenshire in a range of venues where there is access to young people e.g Youth Centres, Job Centres and Voluntary Sector Venues.

#### **10 Intervention guides**

The 'Hope for the Children Programme' is a comprehensive set of resources for assessment, analysis and intervention written by the Child & Family Team at Tavistock Centre, London. It is a series of guides containing a step by step approach to intervention and worksheets. The guides were developed using evidence based approaches, with clear outcomes.

The resources are intended to empower children, young people and their families and practitioners working together, building on strength and overcoming difficulties.

Successful change is evidenced through the improved wellbeing of children and young people. Only when at least one key worker in an agency has completed the training outlined above the agency will be given a set of guides to use with families. The next training will be held on 10<sup>th</sup> July 2018.
