This training covers 'Early Years Maths Outdoors' which is for practitioners seeking to develop their skills and their outdoor areas to support early years maths learning. This training also covers using the rich stimulus outdoor environment, 'Early Years Literacy Outdoors' looks at creating spaces and professional practice that encourage conversation, cooperative play, and imagination in young children. The session explores schemas and their links to the characteristics of effective learning, develops understanding of core schema concepts, and examines how children use exploratory play as a foundation for extending their schematic interests. It also considers ways to support children in representing their investigations symbolically, nurturing their curiosity around cause and effect, and enriching their language and thinking through schema-based experiences. Book through FIS and a code will be sent	Bladder and Bowel Health– Potty / Toilet Training This session aims to increase practitioners' confidence in discussing the start of potty/toilet training with families, including those of children with additional needs. Participants will develop an understanding of the importance of healthy bladder and bowel habits and the impact these have on successful potty/toilet training, while learning how to identify and share appropriate ERIC resources to support families throughout their child's journey. The training will also raise awareness of ERIC's <i>Let's Go Potty</i> approach and the benefits of adopting it within an early years setting. In addition, participants will understand the importance of having a clear Potty Training Policy to ensure a consistent approach among all practitioners and for all children.
